Who Should Participate?

This workshop is designed for clinicians who respond to severe trauma incidents - rural emergency medicine/critical care/ICU physicians, general practitioners, paramedics and nursing staff

Topics Covered

- Recognition of the severe trauma patient
- Initial assessment of the trauma patient; primary and secondary survey
- Initial resuscitation of the severe trauma patient (airway, breathing, circulation, disability-neurocritical care)
- Procedures in severe trauma
 - Basic airway manoeuvres, airway adjuncts
 - Advanced airway procedures-RSI, ope cricothyrotomy,
 - ventilation strategies
 - needle decompression, finger thoracostomy and chest drain insertion
 - fluid management
 - fracture reduction and splintage
- Human factors controlling self, patient, environment, systems, and debriefing after major trauma
- Disposition for referring and transferring the trauma patient

Learning Outcomes

- Recognise and initiate assessment of the trauma patient
- Demonstrate practical proficiency in performing procedures in severe trauma, including advanced airway, breathing and circulation procedures
- Identify and manage human and environmental factors influencing the trauma setting
- Describe trauma systems to effectively refer and transfer patients to regional and major trauma services.
