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New Approach to Mental Health and Drug & Alcohol Services in Western NSW

part of the Western NSW commissioning of mental health and drug & alcohol services, the Western NSW Mental Health and Drug & Alcohol Stepped Care Integration Planning Executive Group (SCIPEG) has recently been established. SCIPEG, jointly chaired by the WNSW PHN and Local Health Districts (Western and Far West), brings stakeholders together and ensures resources are used efficiently, with the aim of identifying

service gaps and designing improved mental health services that match the needs of the community.

The third meeting of SCIPEG was held in Dubbo on 31 August - plans to develop a combined regional strategy for Stepped Care continued, as well as a review of the availability of self-help services for mental health.

SCIPEG allows all members to represent the full voice of their constituency in the design of the Stepped Care Model, without establishing a potential conflict of interest in a future commissioning process.

My Health Record - A Patient Journey

A patient's My Health Record can provide important information for healthcare providers in every step of an individual's health journey. A My Health Record gives both patients and health professionals immediate access to a patient's necessary health information on-line - this helps to improve co-ordinated care outcomes, reduce duplication and provide vital information in emergency situations.

The benefits of My Health Record are illustrated in "A Patient's Journey". For Brian, beyond the emergency department, supplementary information in the discharge summary was visible in his My Health Record – helping inform other healthcare providers involved in his care.

Brian is 62 years old and was diagnosed with Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus almost two years ago since then his condition has been managed through diet management and lifestyle changes...

Working Together to Support Vulnerable Families

The Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act 1998 has been amended to allow certain private health professionals to share information relating to the safety, welfare and wellbeing of children and young people.

legislative change reflects the important role private health professionals play in identifying and responding to vulnerable families.

As a result of the amendment affecting section 27A of the Care Act, all registered medical practitioners and general practice nurses can now consult with and report to the NSW Health Child Wellbeing Unit if they have concerns regarding the safety, welfare or wellbeing of a child, young person or unborn child. In doing so, they can meet their mandatory reporting obligations under the Care Act.

The regulatory changes are indicative of the important role health practitioners play in identifying

and responding to child protection concerns, and provide a mechanism for private health professionals to coordinate services and better meet the needs of vulnerable families.

Tackling Indigenous Smoking **Portal**

The first edition of the Australian Indigenous Alcohol and Other Drugs Knowledge Centre's Tackling Indigenous Smoking (TIS) portal is now available at www.tacklingsmoking.org.au.



The portal has been developed by the National Best Practice Unit for Tackling Indigenous Smoking (NBPU TIS) and includes the TIS Resource and Information Centre (TISRIC). The portal is located on the Australian Indigenous HealthInfoNet.

The portal contains a comprehensive collection of videos and programs, workforce information such as conferences, jobs, courses, and other events and training. There is also a Members-only Yarning Place, which aims to foster a community of practice.

While the portal has been designed specifically for TIS grant recipients, the main resources and social media sites (Twitter, Facebook, Instagram and LinkedIn) are free access and can be used by anyone interested in or working in the area of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander smoking reduction and cessation.

Both the portal and the TISRIC are 'living resources' that will be updated and improved as new evidence comes to light, new resources are identified or if feedback is received by the NBPU TIS.
