# Management of acute knee injuries and osteoarthritis – Latest guidelines and evidence

## Presenter

Dr James Coolican, Orthopaedic Surgeon

Knee injuries, pathology and symptoms including stiffness, instability and locking are common presentations in primary care for all ages with varying aetiologies. Consequently, diagnostic investigations and treatment options are wideranging. Rural and regional GPs have an important role in managing these presentations.

The increasing availability of advanced imaging techniques, injectable therapies and surgical interventions has improved management possibilities but also raised concerns about overinvestigation and overtreatment.
