Q fever overview and common issues faced by medical practitioners

Q fever is the most frequently reported and severe zoonosis in Australia. The epidemiology of Q fever goes beyond abattoir workers. This presentation will provide a brief overview of Q fever epidemiology, prevalence and clinical features. It will also provide guidance on identifying who is at risk, the importance of prevention and how to screen patients prior to administering Q fever vaccine.
