Embedding Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Cultural Safety in Western NSW General Practice and Primary Health

The Western NSW PHN is partnering with TAFE NSW to deliver a **Cultural Safety** education session for general practice teams and primary health care providers in our area. This education session will build upon information previously presented at **Cultural Awareness** sessions (attendance at which is not a pre-requisite to participate in this education activity) and will incorporate relevant case-studies to explore the provision of respectful and culturally appropriate care, as per the RACGP Standards for General Practice (5th Edition) to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander patients, through a process of self-reflection, open discussion, sharing of experiences and exploring strategies to achieve sustainable cultural safety in health care delivery to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander populations in Western NSW.
