## 1. About the Western NSW Primary Health Network

The Western NSW Primary Health Network (WNSW PHN), is one of 31 Primary Health Networks across Australia, established to support frontline health services and increase the efficiency and effectiveness of primary health care. Our focus is people who are at risk of poor health outcomes and working to improve the coordination of their care, so they receive the right care in the right place at the right time. We work closely with key stakeholders including general practice, other health care providers, Local Health Districts, hospitals and the broader community to align services with the health needs of the region.

WNSW PHN is a not-for-profit organisation primarily funded by the Australian Government.

WNSW PHN covers both Far West and Western NSW Local Health Districts across a total area of 433,379 square kilometres, making it the largest PHN in NSW (at 53.5%). The total population is estimated to be over 312,000 people, with 20.3% over the age of 65 years. Approximately 11.36% of people in the WNSW PHN region identify as First Nations (ABS, 2021).

## 2. Background - Primary Health Care Vaccination Grants Program

Since 2020, WNSW PHN has been leading a range of initiatives to support the local primary health care sector in responding to local COVID-19 vaccination needs. To further enable local primary health care providers to support priority populations across the WNSW PHN footprint, WNSW PHN is offering funding through the Primary Health Care Vaccination Grants Program 2025. The program aims to:

- 1. Increase the number of local General Practices, Aboriginal Medical Services and Pharmacies stocking and delivering COVID-19 vaccinations.
- 2. Increase the number of General Practices, Aboriginal Medical Services and Pharmacies providing vaccination to priority populations where there is unmet vaccination needs.

WNSW PHN invites applications from eligible organisations for the Grant Program. Relevant information for application is provided below.

## 3. Key Grants Details

Grant funding is offered via two streams.

#### Stream One Stream Two **New Vaccinators** Priority Populations - Outreach Clinics A once-off payment of \$2,000 (excl. GST) for Total funding of up to \$14,000 (excl. GST) is General Practices, Aboriginal Medical Services available for General Practices, Aboriginal Medical Services and Pharmacies currently and Pharmacies currently not offering COVID-19 vaccination who agree to stock and offering COVID-19 vaccination to provide administer COVID-19 vaccinations. \* outreach clinics to priority community groups \*\* currently not receiving access to vaccination providers, including: First Nations Rural, Remote and Hard to Reach Aged Care Disability Homelessness Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Groups Applicants are encouraged to use the clinics as opportunities to co-administer MBS eligible National Immunisation Program (NIP) vaccines where appropriate. \* Grant recipients that successfully meet their obligations \*\* WNSW PHN is available to assist in identifying local under Stream One funding, will be permitted to apply for priority groups where gaps exist. funding under Stream Two outside of the Grant funding cycle.

## 5. Grant Timelines

Grant Applications Open: 6 June 2025 Grant Applications Close: 20 June 2025

Grants Awarded: Within 10 business days of receipt of application Activity Completion: Within 3 months of executing Grant Agreement

To ensure timely administration of Grant applications, WNSW PHN will review and process application as they are received.

- 2. Successful applicants will be required to enter into a Grant Agreement with WNSW PHN.

- 5. Successful Grants may be publicly listed on the WNSW PHN website.
- 6. Applicant must ensure compliance with working with children checks.
- 7. Applicant must acknowledge WNSW PHN in promotions.

#### 9. Assessment Criteria

Applications will be evaluated based on:

- 1. Submission of fully completed application.
- 2. Meeting the eligibility criteria outlined in Section 6.
- 3. Capacity to meet the expected deliverables.
