The Blayney Local Government Area is located in the Central Tablelands of New South Wales and covers 1,525 square kilometres in area. While predominantly rural in nature, the Blayney Shire supports agricultural industries as well as mining and manufacturing. It is comprised of the principal town of Blayney, as well as a number of villages including Carcoar and Millthorpe. The Shire has quality schools and facilities that support participation in sports, recreation and healthy lifestyles.

Drivers of health

Based on a range of social and economic characteristics, the ABS Index of Relative Socio-economic Disadvantage (IRSD) score of 982 for the Blavney LGA indicates greater disadvantage when compared to the NSW average IRSD of 1002. However, Blayney is ranked in the top 25% most socio-economically advantaged LGAs in the Western NSW Primary Health Network region.

Health service gaps



WNSW Telephone Community Health Survey 2018 showed the gaps were in medical specialists and GP access.

- 20% reported gaps in speciality care
- 18% reported GP Access and lack of GPs in their community.
