# COVID-19: Financial Support for General Practices

There is a variety support measures that have been put in place for General Practices impacted by COVID-19, including measures by the Australian and NSW Governments, the ATO and Australian banks.

# **Support Measures from the Australian Government**

## Cash payments for small and medium-sized businesses

The Government is providing up to \$100,000 to eligible small and medium sized businesses, and not-for-profits (including charities) that employ people, with a minimum payment of \$20,000. These payments will help businesses' and not-for-profits' cash flow so they can keep operating, pay their rent, electricity and other bills and retain staff.

## **Support for Business Asset Investment**

The Government is increasing the instant asset write-off (IAWO) threshold from \$30,000 to \$150,000 and expanding access to include all businesses with aggregated annual turnover of less than \$500 million (up from \$50 million) until 30 June 2020. In 2017-18 there were more than 360,000 businesses that benefited from the current IAWO, claiming deductions to the value of over \$4 billion.

# **Temporary Relief for financially distressed businesses**

The Australian Government has temporarily increased the threshold at which creditors can issue a statutory demand on a company and the time companies have to respond. The package also includes temporary relief for Directors from any personal liability for trading while insolvent.

## **Job Keeper Payment**

Under the JobKeeper Payment, businesses impacted by the Coronavirus will be able to access a subsidy from the Government to continue paying their employees. Affected employers will be able to claim a fortnightly payment of \$1,500 per eligible employee from 30 March 2020, for a maximum period of 6 months.

## **Practice Incentive Payments**

Temporary increases to incentive payments for general practices will increase support for bulk billed services and ensure patients keep access to essential face-toface care. GP Practices that open for face-to-face services for a minimum of four hours a day (or for part time practices for an average of 50% of their normal practice opening hours) will have their next two Practice Incentive Program Quality Improvement (PIPQI) payments doubled. These payments will be made on 1 May 2020 and 1 August 2020.

### **Bulk Billing Incentive Payment**

The Australian Government has also announced the bulk-billing incentive payment for pensioners, under-16s and concession card holders will be doubled for face-toface and telehealth services during the COVID-19 response.

# **Support Measures from NSW Government**

The NSW Government has put in place a range of initiatives to assist businesses during the response to COVID-19.

These include:

- Waiver of payroll tax for businesses with payrolls of up to \$10 million for three months (the rest of 2019-20)
- Bringing forward the next round of payroll tax cuts by raising the threshold limit to \$1 million in 2020-21
- \$10,000 Grant for Small businesses who do not pay tac on their payrolls

# **Support Measures from Financial Institutions**

### **Small Business Loan Repayment Deferments**

The Australian Banking Association has announced banks will defer small business loan repayments for up to 6 months on business loans of up to \$10 million.

### Small and medium enterprise (SME) guarantee scheme

The Australian Government will guarantee 50% of the value of eligible business loans to small and medium enterprises impacted by COVID-19. Maximum loan value is \$250,000 and there will be a repayment-free period of six months.
